I. Roll Call

Chair Hoang called the meeting to order, confirming enough members for a quorum, at 1:30 p.m.

II. Review and Approval of the April 15, 2026, Meeting Minutes

Chair Hoang led the review and approval of the previous meeting minutes. His motion to approve the minutes was supported by Member McKee and Member Chee after minor typographical corrections to members' names. Minutes were voting unanimously in favor.

III. Public Testimony

IV. Annual Privacy Impact Assessment (PIA) Process

Chair Hoang provided an update on the annual Privacy Impact Assessment (PIA) process, recommending continuation of last year's form, revision of the memorandum, and collection of reports from state and local agencies, with ETS aiming to improve the process and inviting input from council members.

Chair Hoang recommended to revise and distribute the memorandum to state and local agencies as a formal reminder of the annual Privacy Impact Assessment due in September, and to report back to the Council on progress made to improve the PIA process using application portfolio management software and make recommendations if successful.

V. Phishing Resistant Multi-Factor Authentication

Chair Hoang discussed the importance of phishing resistant multifactor authentication (MFA), highlighting the limitations of SMS-based methods and advocating for adoption of mobile applications and passkeys, with ETS enabling these controls for both enterprise and resident-facing systems.

VI. Information Technology Internal Security Controls

Chair Hoang announced upcoming cybersecurity and privacy events, including Cyber Hawaii sessions at the University of Hawaii at Manoa and West Oahu, and a networking event at the Entrepreneur Sandbox, inviting council members to share additional events.

Chair Hoang solicited suggestions for future agenda items, to prepare updates on AI-related efforts, including discussions with OpenAI and Anthropic, for the next meeting agenda. Chair Hoang indicated continued discussion on the annual PIA process and updates on AI initiatives, and announced the next meeting scheduled for August 19th, one month before the PIA report is due.

Chair Hoang announced the 2-day 4th Annual Hawaii Cybersecurity Conference on June 23 and 24, 2026.
