V. Phishing Resistant Multi-Factor Authentication

- a. Phishing-resistant multi-factor authentication is a stronger form of MFA that uses methods like passkeys, FIDO2 security keys, or certificate-based authentication so attackers cannot steal or reuse your login codes, even if you click on a phishing link. These methods verify the device itself rather than relying on codes or prompts that can be tricked or intercepted.
